

Psalm 37:31, “The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide.”



We can all walk with confidence with God’s Word hidden in our hearts.

Psalm 119:2-6, “Blessed are they that keep his testimonies, and that seek him with the whole heart. They also do no iniquity: they walk in his ways. Thou hast commanded us to keep thy precepts diligently. O that my ways were directed to keep thy statutes! Then shall I not be ashamed, when I have respect unto all thy commandments.”

Psalm 26:1, “Judge me, O LORD; for I have walked in mine integrity: I have trusted also in the LORD; therefore I shall not slide.”

Psalm 94:18, “When I said, My foot slippeth; thy mercy, O LORD, held me up.”

Psalm 108:1, “O God, my heart is fixed; I will sing and give praise, even with my glory.”

Psalm 112:7, “He shall not be afraid of evil tidings: his heart is fixed, trusting in the LORD.”

I John 2:10, “He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him.”

Psalm 55:22, “Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.”

Hebrews 2:1, “Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip.”

Psalm 15:2-5, "He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart. He that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbour. In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the LORD. He that sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not. He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things shall never be moved."

Psalm 15 seems to give us a list of things to follow in order to keep our feet from slipping.

- 1) Walking uprightly
- 2) Working righteousness
- 3) Speaking truth in his heart
- 4) Not a gossip
- 5) Does good towards his neighbor
- 6) Doesn't reproach his neighbor
- 7) Stand against vileness in people
- 8) Honor's people that fear the LORD
- 9) His word is his bond; even if it causes him hurt, he will not change.
- 10) He doesn't seek to gain profit off of others. He is not a user.
- 11) He stands with the innocent.

Jeremiah 10:23-24, "O LORD, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps. O LORD, correct me, but with judgment; not in thine anger, lest thou bring me to nothing."
