

Psalm 5:3, “My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up.”



Psalm 55:16-17, “As for me, I will call upon God; and the LORD shall save me. Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice.”

Psalm 59:16, “But I will sing of thy power; yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning: for thou hast been my defence and refuge in the day of my trouble.”

Psalm 88:13, “But unto thee have I cried, O LORD; and in the morning shall my prayer prevent thee.”

Psalm 4:4, “Stand in awe, and sin not: commune with your own heart upon your bed, and be still. Selah.”

Mornings should never begin without proper time with God, looking towards Him for direction for the day. Never cheat yourself out of your morning Bible and prayer time. That’s worse than not eating breakfast. Your soul needs feeding and cleansing each day.

What prevents me from looking up? Shame

Psalm 40:12, “For innumerable evils have compassed me about: mine iniquities have taken hold upon me, so that I am not able to look up; they are more than the hairs of mine head: there my heart faileth me.”

Our morning time helps us reflect upon our lives and seek forgiveness. Each day we must clean our hearts and be prepared, because tomorrow morning may be the day you look up and see Jesus coming!

Luke 21:25-28, “And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; Men’s hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken. And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh.”
