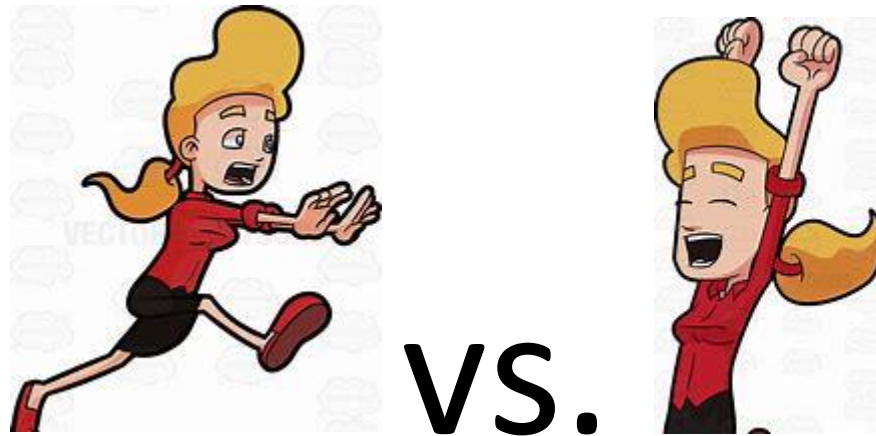


**Psalm 27:1, “The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?  
The LORD is the strength of my life: of whom shall I be afraid?”**



What’s the difference between being afraid and having victory?
