


Psalm 56: 10-11, “In God will I praise his word: in the LORD will I praise his word. In God have I put my trust: I will not be afraid what man can do unto me.”



2 Timothy 1:7, “For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.”

Who is the author of fear?

1 John 4:18, “There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear; because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.”

Why does Satan attack us with fear?

Revelation 2:10, “Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life.”

Do we fear if we are called to suffer? Do we fear the unknown?

Numbers 14:9, "Only rebel not ye against the LORD, neither fear ye the people of the land; for they are bread for us: their defence is departed from them, and the LORD is with us: fear them not."

When we allow fear to take control of our spirit, how does God view our decision?

Deuteronomy 1:29, "Then I said unto you, Dread not, neither be afraid of them."

Deuteronomy 3:22, "Ye shall not fear them: for the LORD your God he shall fight for you."

Deuteronomy 7:21, "Thou shalt not be affrighted at them: for the LORD thy God is among you, a mighty God and terrible."

Deuteronomy 20:3, "And shall say unto them, Hear, O Israel, ye approach this day unto battle against your enemies: let not your hearts faint, fear not, and do not tremble, neither be ye terrified because of them."

Deuteronomy 31:6, "Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the LORD thy God, he it is that doth go with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee."

Deuteronomy 31:8, "And the LORD, he it is that doth go before thee; he will be with thee, he will not fail thee, neither forsake thee: fear not, neither be dismayed."

Joshua 10:25, "And Joshua said unto them, Fear not, nor be dismayed, be strong and of good courage: for thus shall the LORD do to all your enemies against whom ye fight."

2 Kings 6:16, "And he answered, Fear not: for they that be with us are more than they that be with them."

Psalms 3:6, "I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people, that have set themselves against me round about."

Psalms 27:1, "The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?"

Psalms 27:3, "Though an host should encamp against me, my heart shall not fear: though war should rise against me, in this will I be confident."

Psalms 46:2, "Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea;"

Psalms 56:3-4, "What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee. In God I will praise his word, in God I have put my trust; I will not fear what flesh can do unto me."

What is our source that we depend upon to battle our fear?

Psalms 112:7, "He shall not be afraid of evil tidings: his heart is fixed, trusting in the LORD."

Psalms 118:6, "The LORD is on my side; I will not fear: what can man do unto me?"

Proverbs 3:25, "Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh."

We all experience times where we are suddenly in fear: our first reaction. What can we do when those times come?

Isaiah 35:4, "Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he will come and save you."

Isaiah 41:10, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness."

Isaiah 41:13, "For I the LORD thy God will hold thy right hand, saying unto thee, Fear not; I will help thee."

Isaiah 51:7, "Hearken unto me, ye that know righteousness, the people in whose heart is my law; fear ye not the reproach of men, neither be ye afraid of their revilings."

Don't be afraid of being reproached or of men's revilings. (Reproach – to censure, to charge with a fault in severe language, to upbraid, to suggest blame, to treat with scorn or contempt. Reviling-Treating with reproachful words.)

Jeremiah 1:8, "Be not afraid of their faces: for I am with thee to deliver thee, saith the LORD."

My mother often used the phrase, "If looks could kill"; Don't be afraid of looks.

Jeremiah 23:4, "And I will set up shepherds over them which shall feed them: and they shall fear no more, nor be dismayed, neither shall they be lacking, saith the LORD."

Jeremiah 51:46, "And lest your heart faint, and ye fear for the rumour that shall be heard in the land; a rumour shall both come one year, and after that in another year shall come a rumour, and violence in the land, ruler against ruler."

When false accusations are spread that causes us to fear, what should we do?

Ezekiel 2:6, "And thou, son of man, be not afraid of them, neither be afraid of their words, though briers and thorns be with thee, and thou dost dwell among scorpions: be not afraid of their words, nor be dismayed at their looks, though they be a rebellious house."

Ezekiel 3:9, "As an adamant harder than flint have I made thy forehead: fear them not, neither be dismayed at their looks, though they be a rebellious house."

Zephaniah 3:16, "In that day it shall be said to Jerusalem, Fear thou not: and to Zion, Let not thine hands be slack."

Satan has one goal in mind when he brings fear into our thoughts: Cause them to make wrong decisions and/or freeze in their tracks doing nothing for Christ.
