

Psalm 71:1, “In thee, O LORD, do I put my trust: let me never be put to confusion.”



I Corinthians 14:33, “For God is not the author of confusion, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints.”

Isaiah 30:1-3, “Woe to the rebellious children, saith the LORD, that take counsel, but not of me; and that cover with a covering, but not of my spirit, that they may add sin to sin: That walk to go down into Egypt, and have not asked at my mouth; to strengthen themselves in the strength of Pharaoh, and to trust in the shadow of Egypt! Therefore shall the strength of Pharaoh be your shame, and the trust in the shadow of Egypt your confusion.”

Satan is the author of deception. Deception brings shame and confusion.

Ephesians 4:14, “That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;”

Confusion keeps us in a state of worry and makes us unproductive for Christ. It also leads us into making decisions that can be harmful to us, to others and potentially damages our testimony.

Isaiah 50:7, “For the Lord GOD will help me; therefore shall I not be confounded: therefore have I set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be ashamed.”

The key to avoiding the trap of confusion is the same key to escaping the trap of confusion, God’s Word of Truth. Whenever we turn towards family, friends, television preachers or people we admire as our only source of truth, we become susceptible to confusion. Solid truth can only be found through daily study and application of God’s Word. When someone gives you truth, search the scriptures to verify that it is true according to God.



The only effective weapon to combat the battle raging in your mind is the two edged sword of the Word of God!

Jeremiah 23:29, "Is not my word like as a fire? saith the LORD; and like a hammer that breaketh the rock in pieces?"

Hebrews 4:12, "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any towedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."
