

Mark 10:27, “And Jesus looking upon them saith, With men it is impossible, but not with God: for with God all things are possible.”



Matthew 19:26, “But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible.”

Luke 1:37, “For with God nothing shall be impossible.”

Luke 18:27, “And he said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.”

Genesis 18:14, “Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son.”

Job 42:2, “I know that thou canst do every thing, and that no thought can be withholden from thee.”

Jeremiah 32:17, “Ah Lord GOD! behold, thou hast made the heaven and the earth by thy great power and stretched out arm, and there is nothing too hard for thee:”

Jeremiah 32:27, “Behold, I am the LORD, the God of all flesh: is there any thing too hard for me?”

Our God is more abundantly powerful than we can comprehend. At times we are like the waves of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. We find ourselves doubting that God can do some miracle to fix our impossible situation. James warns about this heart attitude:

James 1:5-8, “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.”

Matthew 17:19-21, “Then came the disciples to Jesus apart, and said, Why could not we cast him out? And Jesus said unto them, Because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, If ye have faith as a grain of

mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting.”

I find this verse very interesting and noticed several things:

- 1) My unbelief limits the work of God solving the impossibilities in my life.
- 2) I only need a little faith, God takes care of the rest (mustard seed is the smallest seed).
- 3) My mountains or difficulties in life don't go away without asking God to move them.
- 4) God will give me guidance in how to specifically pray about my mountain; telling me exactly where to move it to – yonder place!
- 5) With His guidance, I can pray with confidence knowing that 'it shall remove'.
- 6) God not only honors my faith, He rejoices in answering my prayers of faith. Why? His power is exalted to others whom are watching!
- 7) God promises the victory over my mountain. It may take time, but the impossible mountain will move.
- 8) I must be willing to sacrifice self and spend hours in fasting and prayer. What a small price to pay for a mountain of impossibility to be moved.
- 9) The answer to my prayers will build my faith and God can use it to build the faith of others. He can also you it to see others come to Him for salvation of their souls.

Zechariah 8:6, “Thus saith the LORD of hosts; If it be marvelous in the eyes of the remnant of this people in these days, should it also be marvelous in mine eyes? Saith the LORD of hosts.”

I personally believe that God enjoys proving to men that He is the God of the impossible; it is marvelous in our eyes and in His eyes.

Romans 4:21, “And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform.”

Isaiah 64:4, “For since the beginning of the world men have not heard, nor perceived by the ear, neither hath the eye seen, O God, beside thee, what he hath prepared for him that waiteth for him.”

Psalms 31:19, “Oh how great is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for them that fear thee; which thou hast wrought for them that trust in thee before the sons of men!”

1 Corinthians 2:9, “But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.”
